Seminar Description: In this clinical case seminar, master clinician and Jungian theorist Don Kalsched will teach his approach and intervention methods in the treatment of patients with early trauma.

Target Audience, Educational Methods & Objectives: This is an advanced seminar for clinical psychologists, clinical social workers, counselors and other mental health professionals. Dr. Kalsched will teach his approach and intervention methods in the treatment of patients with early trauma through discussion of clinical cases and case vignettes brought by participants.

Participants will:

1. Learn how to recognize images and motifs in dreams that show the struggle between "life" and "anti-life" forces in the inner world of their patients
2. Understand the difference between true ego-resources and the ego's identification with defensive inner structures
3. Recognize how the structures in the inner world of trauma enter the transference and countertransference
4. Become aware of how dissociation works in the bi-personal field to inspire "enactments" and how these ruptures may be repaired
